
Small town hopping in the heart of Switzerland

The colourful old town forms the heart of medieval Willisau. Two mighty town gates and the fortress frame the town centre, where small, local shops selling regional specialities line the streets. Sursee is a small, picturesque town that offers visitors a mixture of historical charm and modern flair. The wellpreserved old town with its medieval buildings and narrow alleyways is perfect for a stroll. Charming Sempach is known above all for its past. Surrounded by the town wall, it is a wonderful place to stroll and travel back in time. The idyllic location on Lake Sempach is another argument in favour of a visit. The deep connection to tradition and culture is clearly noticeable in Stans. Between the cosy alleyways, hidden parks and gardens, you can discover witnesses of the past and present time and again.

Sarnen is the enchanting capital of the canton of Obwalden. The picturesque old town is characterised by typical wooden houses and cobbled streets. A cosy location surrounded by mountains, vineyards and Lake Sarnen.

The lively little town of Schwyz, capital of the canton of the same name, is home to some hidden treasures. These include the most important founding documents of Switzerland, numerous cherry blossom trees and culinary hotspots. Visitors to Altdorf are greeted by the national hero himself, William Tell. The small town, steeped in history and with its winding alleyways, lies in a narrow valley basin. Between the lake and the mountains lies the city of Lucerne, which many people only know for its famous Chapel Bridge and water tower. But away from the tourist magnets, there are vibrant neighbourhoods and cosy squares.
