Inspiring story

Lucerne through Turner's eyes

On Lake Lucerne with the master of English Romanticism

6 a.m. in Lucerne. When the first morning boat sets out from the station quay towards Weggis, there are usually not many passengers on board – just a few commuters rubbing the sleep from their eyes. Fanni Fetzer, Director of the Museum of Art Lucerne, is not one of the regular passengers on this route. Today is an exception, and with good reason.

Joseph Mallord William Turner (1775–1851) was in search of the beautiful and the sublime. This search continued in Switzerland, where he studied the unique interplay of light and weather, lake and mountains. And he was equally fascinating by the menacing, dangerous side of nature.

In the summer of 2019, the Museum of Art Lucerne will show a selection of Turner's masterpieces, under the curatorial direction of Fanni Fetzer and co-curator Beat Wismer. The exhibition marks a very special occasion: in 2019, the Lucerne Art Society – the sponsor of the Museum of Art Lucerne – celebrates its 200th anniversary. Turner's masterpieces are returning to the place where they originated some 200 years ago. The exhibition "Turner. The Sea and the Alps" showcases 100 works from the Tate Gallery collection in London. The focus is on subjects from the Lucerne and Lake Lucerne region. However, Turner's travels in general are also discussed: his crossing the sea and his representation of the Alpine world.







Inspiring story

The Mythen Man

Armin Schelbert, the summiteer.

Armin Schelbert has been hiking up his favourite mountain, the Gross Mythen, several times a day for about 20 years now. He has climbed it more than 4,600 times in his life – more often than anyone else. Boring? Not for Armin Schelbert. He never fails to be fascinated by the mountain, nature and magnificent views at 1,898m and the magical sunrise from the top of the peak, of course.

Armin Schelbert is a retired site manager and a true mountain man, with a dark tan, snow-white hair and a well-groomed beard. Now aged 74, he grew up in Schindellegi not far from the Gross Mythen. Today, he lives at the foot of the peak during the week, so he can pursue his passion every day.

The «Gross Mythen» mountain lies in the heart of Switzerland, between Schwyz and Einsiedeln. Together with the Klein Mythen and Haggenspitz, it forms the Mythen massif.

Gross Mythen is the most dominant mountain in Schwyz, reigning majestically above the village. The route leads from Schwyz via the St. Josef convent in Loo (Klösterli) to Mythenbad and Holzegg, which lies at the foot of Gross Mythen. This marks the entrance to the magnificent alpine world of the Mythen.

Hiking in the Lucerne-Lake Lucerne Region

Lucerne is the starting point for hiking adventures in the Lucerne-Lake Lucerne Region. The region offers a superbly way marked network of footpaths and superlative views from mountains like Titlis and Pilatus. The various levels of difficulty provide a range of challenges, including meadows, panoramic paths and exposed ridges. Combine your outing with an adventurous aerial cableway ride or leisurely boat trip on Lake Lucerne. The world's steepest cogwheel railway will bring you onto the Pilatus (2,132 m a.s.l.) and the first rotating cable railway onto the Titlis glacier (3041 m a.s.l.). Almost without exception, the starting points of the hikes can be reached by public transport. Discover what the region has to offer on foot:
