
Switzerland and winter? It's a perfect match.

Europe's highest Christmas market.

From 17 to 19 November, Europe's highest Christmas market returns to Mount Pilatus. Visitors can enjoy delights from over 40 festive market stalls as well as stunning views of the surrounding lakes and Alps, all at 2,132m above sea level.

Hotel Drei Berge in Mürren, formerly the Hotel Bellevue, renamed after three nearby mountains (Eiger, Mönch and Jungfrau), will soon welcome its first winter guests.

Also seeing in its first full winter season is the Mad Mount Hotel in Nendaz, one of the first carbon-negative hotels in the country.

First View, a new observation platform which opened this summer, is located on the summit of the First mountain. With its windmill-like design, it offers 360-degree views of the surrounding peaks, including the Eiger, Mönch and Jungfrau. Those after an adventure can also explore the First Cliff Walk.

Cotton Club Andermatt.

In early December, the Cotton Club will open its doors at the Swiss House, formerly run by five-star hotel The Chedi, in the historic Alpine village of Andermatt. The first Cotton Club to open in the mountains, this will be the perfect venue to enjoy casual daytime food and drink, fine dining or upmarket après, all with stunning views.

46° slope: The Black Wall.

If the snow conditions are favourable this year, early December will coincide with the launch of the super steep new 3km black run in Glacier 3000, the Black Wall. With an incline of 46°, this slope will delight snowsport enthusiasts with a thirst for thrills.

Markets in Bern.

The 'Berner Zibelemärit' (Onion Market) is a traditional festival where local farmers bring over 50 tonnes of onions and garlic to the Swiss capital. This year, the festival will take place on Monday 27 November, and will comprise over 15 Christmas markets across the city, including the Star Market and its Fondue Chalet and a market in front of the Bern Minster, which boasts Switzerland's highest church steeple.
