
# From region to region, great wines and gourmet destinations

They produce white, red as well as rosé wine from almost 200 varieties of grapes. Some of these wines are already available in Québec, and during *Montréal en Lumière*, the producers will be delighted to present them to you. If these culinary discoveries should leave you craving for more, the "Grand Tour of Switzerland" will enable you to experience Swiss hospitality and cuisine. The tour will take you through breathtaking landscapes and also enable you to visit cities, such as Geneva and its museums, Zurich and its galleries and boutiques, Bern featuring a lovely farmer's market steps from the Parliament, and Fribourg with its local delicacies. The Glacier-Express departing from Zermatt and featuring an on board gourmet menu is a special treat, allowing you to take in the spectacular scenery, and perhaps a peak at the Matterhorn.
