Bernina Express - From glaciers to palm trees.



The Bernina Express is the most spectacular of all Alpine crossings. It seamlessly connects the cool north with the warm sunny south, effortlessly overcoming the steepest gradients. This is one of the most beautiful rail trips in the world. Crossing the Alps in the Bernina Express is an unforgettable experience. From Chur, Switzerland's oldest town, the train passes through the dark Schinschlucht (Schin Canyon) and over the roughly 90-metre-high Solis Viaduct into the wild and romantic Albula Valley. Near Filisur, the train glides over the 65-metre-high Landwasser Viaduct – Hollywood-style.

By the time the first distant glaciers sparkle through the panoramic windows, few passengers remain in their seats. The train tackles the 70 permille gradient with ease – and without the help of cogwheel technology. After that, the Bernina Express meanders down through the sun-drenched Val Poschiavo towards the Italian Valtellina region.

Glacier Express - The slowest express train in the world.



The journey in what has been dubbed the world's slowest express train takes travellers across the Alps within roughly eight hours, passing through 91 tunnels and over 291 bridges. The Glacier Express offers a journey for the senses – from Engadine right to the Matterhorn. On its relaxing drive from dazzling St. Moritz to equally sophisticated Zermatt, the Glacier Express delights travellers with scenic attractions and technical state-of-the-art achievements. With its oversized panoramic windows, the Glacier Express opens up unobstructed views of unique landscapes.

GoldenPass Express.



The GoldenPass Express redefines the travel experience between Interlaken and Montreux. Thanks to the world premiere of the Montreux-Berner-Oberland-Bahn, guests can enjoy uninterrupted views for the very first time without having to change trains in Zweisimmen. The exclusive Prestige Class is at the heart of the new panoramic train and offers discerning travellers lots of privacy, maximum comfort in a small cabin and an exquisite culinary selection. How about a glass of Champagne and some fine caviar from Frutigen? The leather seats can be rotated by 180 degrees upon request, and the seat temperature can also be adjusted. Prestige is

operated in addition to 1st and 2nd class. Reservations against a fee are mandatory in Prestige and strongly recommended for travel in 1st and 2nd class. The ticket price in the respective travel class is included for holders of a Swiss Travel Pass. The only downside? The trip already ends after 3 hours and 15 minutes. Most wouldn't mind enjoying it a little longer.

Gotthard Panorama Express - Panoramic journey by boat and train.



The day begins with a welcome slow-down: On the boat cruise from Lucerne to Flüelen, travellers enter the impressive mountain world of Central Switzerland. In just under three hours, visitors pass by fjordlike cliff walls and idyllic coves – all against the magnificent backdrop of snow-covered mountain peaks. Locations steeped in history such as the Rütli Meadow, the Schiller Stone and Tell's Chapel welcome guests with their original Swiss charm. The ride offers plenty of leisure time to enjoy a delicious lunch or a snack and a refreshing drink. At reaching the pier in Flüelen, tour guides are ready to assist in the transfer to the very recognisable panoramic train. During the ride, the most important hotspots will be announced through speakers. Not only the Reuss Valley of canton Uri and the Mediterranean Ticino make for fascinating stories but also the construction history of the railway line itself. The church of Wassen is considered a highlight by many: Thanks to the bold railway layout with its numerous loop tunnels, it can be seen from three different angles. Now the ride continues on through the 15-kilometre long Gotthard Tunnel. Since 1882, it has provided passage through the Swiss Alps towards the south. In the tunnel the train slows down. Thus, passengers get a chance to watch the special light projections depicting various Gotthard legends at their leisure. Drinks and snacks can be ordered directly to the passenger seat.

Luzern-Interlaken Express - Panoramic journey by boat and train.



Lucerne and Interlaken are no doubt two of Switzerland's most popular tourist destinations. However, the most beautiful part is the route that connects them: climbing on board in Central Switzerland, sitting back and relaxing, arriving in the Jungfrau region duly impressed by breathtaking scenic splendour – all in just under two hours. That's the Luzern–Interlaken Express.

En route, the premium panoramic train passes by five crystal clear mountain lakes as well as several waterfalls and rivers. Shortly after Giswil, the train switches to cog drivetrain technology and winds its way up to the Brünig Pass. After the descent it arrives at Brienz, a popular starting point for boat cruises on the lake with the same name. Also well worth visiting: the open-air museum Ballenberg.

The complimentary Swiss Family Card is available at all serviced train stations in Switzerland and through the online booking service. Children under 6 years of age travel free of charge. Children under 16 years of age travelling alone receive a 50% discount on the entire Swiss Travel System ticket range.
