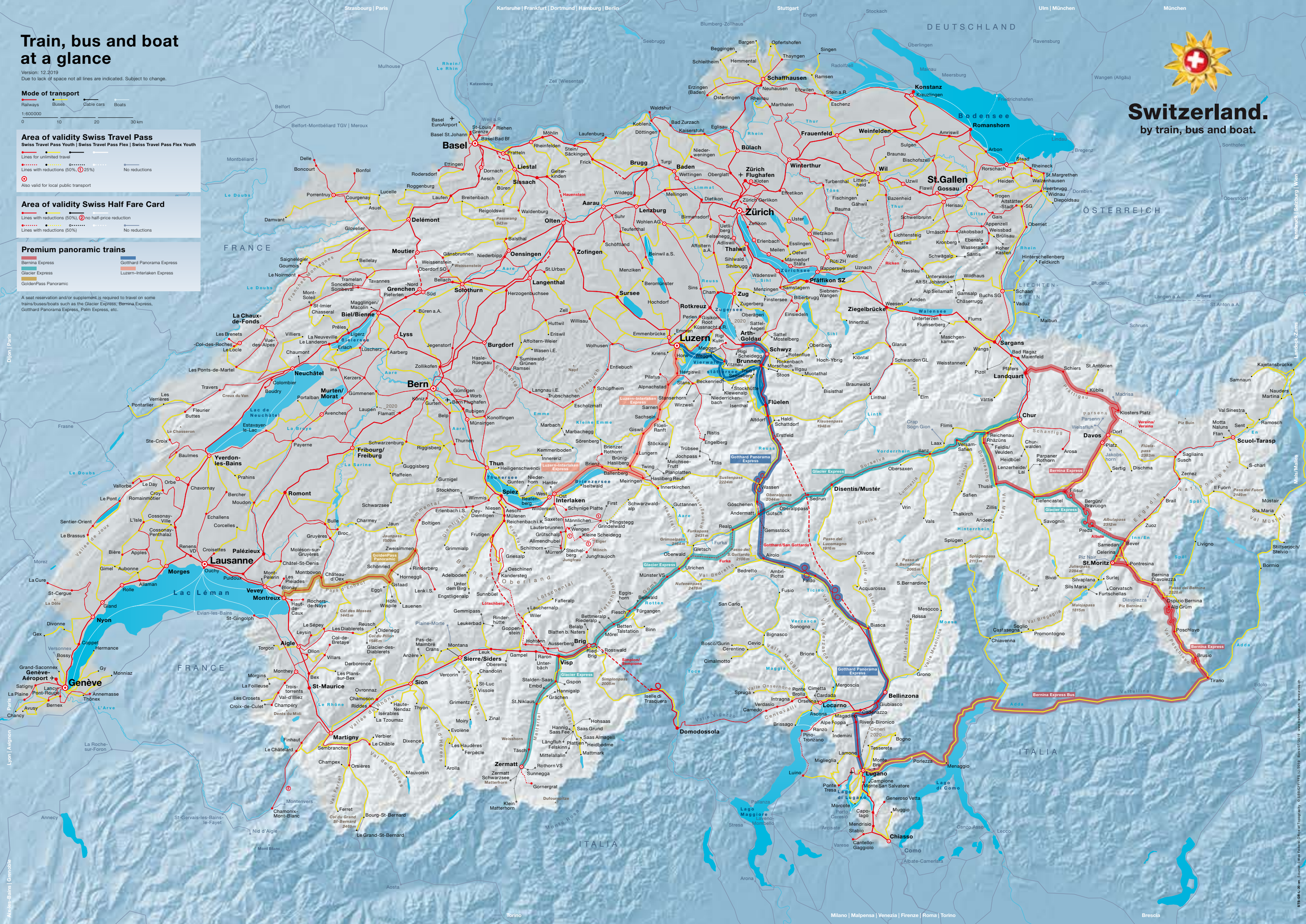

## Travelling by train.

For international arrival or onward journey, guests benefit from more than 80 European connections daily – comfortably from city centre to city centre. Thus, travellers can switch to relaxation mode already on the journey to their destination – enjoying freedom of movement, catering facilities and various onboard services instead of luggage restrictions and long waiting times.





Travelling by train from Germany.

In addition to ICE trains, also IC and EC trains as well as the ÖBB Nightjet and InterCity buses take travellers straight to the major Swiss city centres of Basel, Berne, Chur, Interlaken, Lucerne, Lugano and Zurich from Germany.

ICE between Basel and Zurich

Travelling by train from Austria.

With the comfortable Railjet or the EC trains, travellers arrive in Zurich daily at two-hour intervals. Perfect onward connections to all Swiss regions are guaranteed. Even better: the Nightjet links Vienna to Zurich “in sleep mode”, so to speak.

# General information.

## Good to know: Carefree travelling.

The following basic information will help with understanding how public transport in Switzerland works in order to take the right decisions during the planning process for a journey.

### Public transport network

The Swiss public transport network includes over 29,000 kilometres (18,000 miles) of rail, road and waterway. Hence it is the densest network in the world.

### Harmonised timetable

For international arrival or onward journey, trains and buses are available at border stations and airports. Connections are guaranteed in all places. Where no train service is available, the journey continues by bus, boat or even mountain railway. Hence, interchange is simple and easy to handle all throughout Switzerland.

### Regular-interval timetable

Trains always leave at the same minute after each full hour. Main inter-city connections run at half-hour intervals. At major traffic hubs, trains arrive every full and half hour. Bus and boat connections are perfectly coordinated with these regular-interval timetables. The complete timetable is available at [sbb.ch](https://www.sbb.ch).

### Train categories

- InterCity (IC) trains connect larger cities without intermediate stops
- InterRegio (IR) and RegioExpress (RE) trains connect the medium-sized centres in Switzerland. Regional trains serve all intermediate stations and also provide access to the smaller branches of the network
- Major urban centres have their own suburban railway ("S-Bahn") network. These trains specially marked with an "S" optimally serve the urban and suburban areas with a high-frequency timetable

### 1st class – comfortable travelling

Those who appreciate a bit of luxury travel 1st class. 1st class coaches provide additional amenities such as wider seats, more legroom and electrical power outlets. Furthermore, 1st class passengers benefit from quiet and business zones. Swiss boats also offer the choice between 1st and 2nd class. The 1st class is usually located on the upper deck, which offers a magnificent view of the scenery.

### Seat reservation

- In Switzerland, the majority of trains do not require seat reservation. Trains offering seat reservation are indicated with an "R" in the timetable at [sbb.ch](https://www.sbb.ch)
- For panoramic trains with mandatory seat reservation, reservations should be made at the earliest convenience
- Groups: Reservations for groups of 10 or more persons can be made free of charge at [plabe.gruppen@sbb.ch](mailto:plabe.gruppen@sbb.ch). Information signs and loudspeaker announcements on the train notify travellers of seat reservations

### Surcharge

No surcharge applies on national, InterCity or InterRegio trains within Switzerland. Panoramic trains such as Glacier Express and Bernina Express as well as some PostBus lines (Palm Express) are usually subject to surcharge and/or require seat reservation.

### Rail traffic information

Information about the current traffic situation and possible disruptions on the railway network is available around the clock via [sbb.ch/en/166](https://www.sbb.ch/en/166).

### Security on public transport

Public transportation in Switzerland is generally very safe. Security personnel routinely tours public transportation to guarantee the safety of the passengers and show presence. Criminal offences happen very rarely on public transport. By far the most common offence is travelling without a valid ticket. However, travellers are advised to follow the usual precautions against petty offences (comp. p 84).

The Swiss Travel System product range.

Swiss Travel System tickets and passes are the key to Switzerland’s public transport network. They meet every travel requirement and guarantee nearly unlimited travel by train, bus and boat with just one single ticket.

Swiss Travel Pass and Swiss Travel Pass Flex

**Coverage:** unlimited travel by train, bus and boat including premium panoramic trains and public transport in more than 90 towns and cities. **Validity:** 3, 4, 8 or 15 consecutive, resp. freely selectable days within one month (Flex). **Bonus:** 50% discount on most mountain excursions and free admission to more than 500 museums nationwide. **Discounts:** young travellers up to their 26th birthday receive a 15% discount on the regular Swiss Travel Pass price.

Swiss Travel Pass and Swiss Travel Pass Flex are also available as e-ticket.

Swiss Half Fare Card

**Coverage:** up to 50% discount on travels within the area of validity of the Swiss Travel System passes. **Validity:** 1 month.

Swiss Family Card

**Coverage:** free-of-charge family card complementary to the Swiss Travel System ticket. Children from their 6th up to their 16th birthday travel free of charge when accompanied by at least one parent holding a Swiss Travel System ticket. All travelling children (not accompanied by a parent) receive a 50% discount on the entire Swiss Travel System product range.

Eurail/Interrail.

Boarding in Prag, alighting in Zurich – easy. That’s travelling by train in Europe. The best tickets to do it are the Interrail and Eurail passes. Thus, nothing will get in the way of the individual, freely arranged journey through 32 countries.

Seat reservation

Seat reservation is not included in the Eurail and Interrail passes. For a small surcharge, seat reservations guarantee a comfortable seat on well frequented routes. Especially high-speed trains, international trains and night trains require a seat reservation. For regional and short-distance connections seat reservation is usually not necessary.

Global Pass

The Interrail Global Pass is ideal for persons with permanent residence in a European country. The corresponding product for guests from overseas (permanent residence outside Europe) is a Eurail Global Pass.

# More tickets and passes.

### Point-to-point tickets

Single journey, return trip or round trip: These are the standard tickets available for any given route in the selected class. Holders of a Swiss Half Fare Card are eligible for a discount of up to 50%.

### Supersaver tickets

Supersaver tickets are available for 1st and 2nd class on numerous Swiss railway and other public transport lines. They are only valid on the chosen travel date and for a specifically selected public transport connection (tied to a specific train). Offer subject to availability. Guests receive up to 70% discount on standard and reduced\* fares (\*e.g. with Swiss Half Fare Card). Special regulations apply. Supersaver tickets can neither be changed nor refunded.

### 1-day travelpass

A 1-day travelpass can also be obtained in combination with a Swiss Half Fare Card. It is the ideal ticket for daytrips by train, bus and boat. It is also valid on public transport in most Swiss urban and suburban areas. 1-day travelpasses are available for 1st and 2nd class. Using a Saver Day Pass, guests travel at an even more favourable fare. The earlier a Saver Day Pass is bought, the lower the price.

### Group tickets

With a group ticket, groups of 10 or more persons travel cheaper on public transport: They receive a 30% discount. Various types of group tickets are available in 1st and 2nd class.

- Single journey, return trip or round trip
- Holders of a Swiss Half Fare Card are eligible for a discount of up to 50% on the group fare

### Regional travel system tickets

There are roughly 20 regional traffic and fare associations making it even easier and cheaper for travellers to get around by public transport. They only need one single ticket to travel on the networks of different transportation companies.

### Children travel at reduced prices or even free of charge

Children up to their 6th birthday travel free of charge when accompanied by a holder of a valid ticket. Children from their 6th up to their 16th birthday, and children up to their 6th birthday travelling alone, pay half-price or any defined minimum fare.

- Junior travelcard and Children's Co-travelcard:  
Travellers without a Swiss Travel System ticket may obtain a Junior travelcard or Children's Co-travelcard for CHF 30 per child. With this card, children from their 6th up to their 16th birthday are entitled to travel free of charge for a whole year when accompanied by their parents or some other person.
- 1-day travelpass for children:  
When accompanied by an adult holder of a valid ticket, children from their 6th up to their 16th birthday travel one day in 2nd class for CHF 16 and in 1st class for CHF 32.

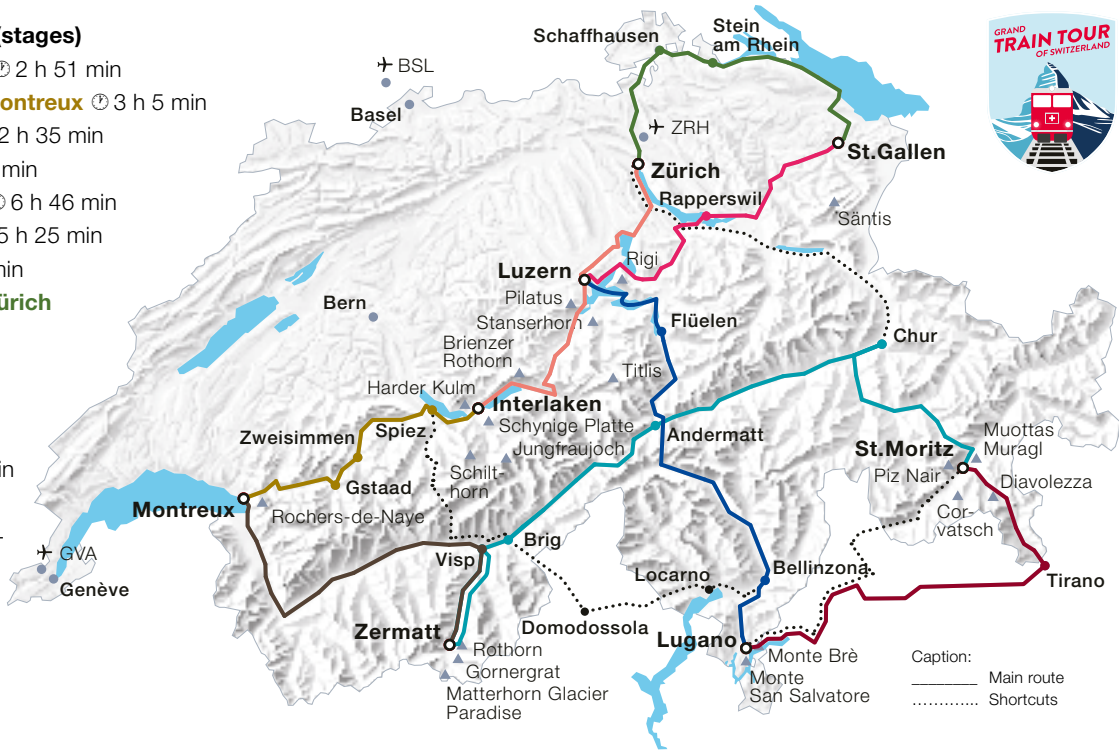

# Route highlights.

## Landwasser Viaduct.

The 65-metre (213 feet) high Landwasser Viaduct, coming into view shortly before the village Filisur, is the most spectacular bridge construction on the Albula Line between Filisur and St. Moritz. The viaduct is made from natural stone and has a length of 142 metres (466 feet). It spans the pristine Landwasser Valley in a bold curve – and dives right into a tunnel.



## UNESCO World Heritage RhB.

Since July 2008, the Rhaetian Railway in the Albula/Bernina area has been a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The railway route between Thusis (Grisons/CH) and Tirano (Valtellina/IT) is an excellent example of the technically innovative development of a mountainous region. As Europe's highest Alpine traversal, it is also one of the most spectacular railway lines in the world.

## Bernina Glaciers.

Three impressive glaciers are among the highlights of the journey. In the Montebello curve, a view of the Morteratsch Glacier opens up. The open crossing of the Bernina Pass at 2,253 metres (7,392 feet) a.s.l. with a view of the Cambrena Glacier is another memorable experience. Alp Grüm may well be the only hotel/restaurant solely accessible by train or on foot. During a photo stop, visitors enjoy the wonderful view of the Palù Glacier and the Bernina Massif.



## Lago di Poschiavo.

This lake has been dammed up by a pre-historic rockslide. Hence, there is no man-made dam in the valley but just a water reservoir at the south end, which helps to control the water level. Le Prese and Miralago, two small villages and popular holiday spots, sit right at the Lago di Poschiavo. At Valposchiavo, the Bernina Express train tracks hug the lakeshore.

## Circular Viaduct Brusio.

The Circular Viaduct is the most distinctive landmark along the Bernina Line. Below Brusio, the Bernina Express negotiates a full altitudinal belt in one double loop of roughly 100 metres (328 feet) diameter each – all without a single tunnel. The open route plan over the viaduct opens the view onto this masterpiece of railway technology as well as a breathtaking panorama.



## A breath of fresh air on the Bernina Express.

On the section between Davos Platz and Tirano, passengers on the Bernina Express may choose to enjoy open coaches. The windowless open-air coaches intensify the experience of nature. Great pictures of the stunning landscape – without any window reflections – are guaranteed.

# Glacier Express.



Deep ravines, high passes, shimmering mountains, sparkling lakes, idyllic mountain villages, 291 bridges and 91 tunnels: On its delightful journey of roughly eight hours, the Glacier Express offers all of this. A breathtaking spectacle across three passes, through six cantons, along eight lakes and past the famous four-thousand-metre (13,000 feet) peaks of the Alps: With three different trains, the GoldenPass Line travels clear across Switzerland – from Lake Lucerne to the wine terraces of the Lavaux, the UNESCO World Heritage Site at the shores of Lake Geneva. # Mountain highlights.

## Lake Riffelsee hiking trip.

After a short ten minutes’ walk from the station Rotenboden, visitors can already admire the world-famous Matterhorn reflection on Lake Riffelsee. Continuing on well-maintained, comfortable walking trails, hikers reach the Riffelberg in less than one hour, enjoying a wonderful view of the Matterhorn the entire time.



## Gourmet ticket.

The Gornergrat gourmet ticket combines a hiking excursion into nature with culinary highlights. An Apéro Riche is served at the 3100 Kulmhotel Gornergrat, then a 3-course gourmet menu at Riffelberg and finally dessert with special coffee on Riffelalp. The various mountain restaurants are accessible by railway, on foot or on skis in winter.

## Highest toboggan run in Switzerland.

With a length of 1.6 kilometres (1 mile), the roughly 10-minute ride from Rotenboden (2,815 m/9,236 ft a.s.l.) to Riffelberg (2,582 m/8,471 ft a.s.l.) is pure fun for young and old alike. Rental toboggans (optionally equipped with children’s seats) and special toboggan day passes are available.



## Priority Boarding.

On the ascent, the best seats at the right-hand side with a perfect view of the Matterhorn are quickly taken. Guests choosing Priority Boarding get to board the Gornergrat train three minutes before the other passengers – thus securing the most coveted seats for the ride.



## Jungfrauoch – Top of Europe.



A mountain of distinction: Not only is the Jungfrauoch home to Europe's highest situated railway station (3,454 m/11,332 ft a.s.l.), it also belongs to the UNESCO World Heritage Site "Swiss Alps Jungfrau-Aletsch". Even the ride up on the cog railway is an unforgettable experience in itself.

## Mountain highlights.

### Snow Fun Park.

At the Snow Fun Park, guests can get refreshed and try their hands at various winter sports. "Snowtubing" with pirouettes on an inflated hoop, speeding down the slope on a sledge, zip-lining over eternal ice on the Flying Fox or skiing and snowboarding – all of this is possible in the Snow Fun Park. What's more, it can be done spontaneously: Equipment is available for renting right there. The ultimate way to experience snow in summer!



### Sphinx viewing platform.

Pressing a button, shooting up, enjoying the mountain panorama: It takes the lift a mere 25 seconds to overcome 108 metres (354 feet) altitude and arrive at the viewing platform at 3,571 metres (11,716 feet) a.s.l. Once there, it's just a matter of inhaling deeply and enjoying the view. Incidentally, Europe's highest research station is also located at the terrace. It is of paramount importance to environmental scientists, astrophysicists and meteorologists.

### Ice Palace.

The more ephemeral – the more beautiful! This is especially true for the "Ice Palace" and its treasures. With ice pick and saw, mountain guides created the halls and corridors in the middle of the Jungfrau firn in the 1930s. Today, artists shape the ice – with a delicate touch. On an icy round tour through this frosty world, guests discover artworks in many niches. Eagles, penguins and bears look like they've just solidified into ice, that's how real they appear. A heart-melting experience, even at minus temperatures.



### Alpine Sensation.

Anybody who steps into the 250-metre (820 feet) long corridor leading from the Sphinx hall to the Ice Palace experiences a shiver down the spine. And that's not only due to the freezing temperatures but also to the memory of the sacrifices that mountain workers made in order to open the Jungfrauoch to railway technology. 30 memorial plaques bear witness of it. The background music causes goose bumps as well: Together with pictures of touristic visionaries, it lets the beginnings of the Jungfrau Railways come to life.

### Jungfrau-Panorama.

There are times that one "cannot see the mountain for all the clouds" on Jungfrauoch. That has nothing to do with bad weather, however – on the contrary. Clouds are fascinating. Who hasn't dreamed of bathing in that fleecy-soft miracle? The Jungfrau Panorama film makes it possible. It offers a 360° panoramic experience of the mountain world, the way it could never be had otherwise – 365 days a year. The camera takes visitors for a dive into the clouds, lets them sink into crevasses and plunge into masses of snow. Independent of what the weather is doing outside.

### Winter hiking.

Not only in summer but also during wintertime the possibilities on Rigi are virtually endless: 35 kilometres (22 miles) of perfectly groomed hiking trails, from easy altitude walks to two-hour panoramic hikes. Enjoying the pristine snowscapes on three signposted snow-shoe trails between 1.1 and 3.5 kilometres (0.7 to 2.2 miles) in length makes for a very special experience.



### Sledge fun.

The five sledding runs offer racy adventures: From Rigi Kulm, from Staffelhöhe and from Rigi Burggeist, sledgers of every age will have plenty of fun in the snowy landscape of Rigi.

## Schilthorn – Piz Gloria.

The Schilthorn area stands for view, thrill and chill: unforgettable views, adrenaline rushes and pure relaxation in a pristine mountain world. ## Mountain highlights.

### 360°-restaurant “Piz Gloria”.

Perfect – before or after the mountain exploration: Within 45 minutes, the revolving 360°-restaurant “Piz Gloria” completes one full rotation while the breathtaking panorama – a genuine natural spectacle with more than 200 mountain summits – silently glides past. The restaurant serves its guests a wide range of dishes: the popular James Bond Brunch and the delicious 007 Burger among other culinary delights.



### Bond World.

The interactive exhibition “Bond World” immerses visitors in seven key scenes from the James Bond movie “On Her Majesty’s Secret Service”. The tour allows guests to experience the film up close. They get detailed information about the making-of, see the original screenplay and may even test their own James Bond skills: from the expert hat-toss in Miss Money-penny’s office, via a helicopter simulator, to an exciting bobsleigh chase.

### Skyline Walk and Thrill Walk.

From the station at Birg, visitors get a unique glimpse of the mountain world of the Schilthorn region. The panoramic platform “Skyline Walk” leads over a sheer precipice and affords a view of the grandiose panorama as well as a glance into the bottomless deep. An even loftier experience – and a veritable adrenaline rush – awaits visitors on the “Thrill Walk”. The adventure starts at the platform and leads along a 200-metre (656-feet) cliff walk, which passes below the cableway station and then turns back towards Birg – truly unforgettable.



### Mountain village Mürren.

On a sun terrace high above the Lauterbrunnen Valley sits the village Mürren. Eiger, Mönch and Jungfrau, the “big three”, seem to be within one’s reach. The picturesque, car-free mountain village attracts visitors with characteristic wooden Chalets and a wonderfully rustic atmosphere.



# Brien Rothorn Railway.

Pure nostalgia: Since 1892, the Brien Rothorn Railway has been steaming its way up to the Rothorn from Brien – a genuinely intact Swiss cultural asset. Within one hour, the steam cog railway negotiates a difference in altitude of 1,678 metres (5,505 feet), passes through eight tunnels and ranks as an absolute must for railway enthusiasts.

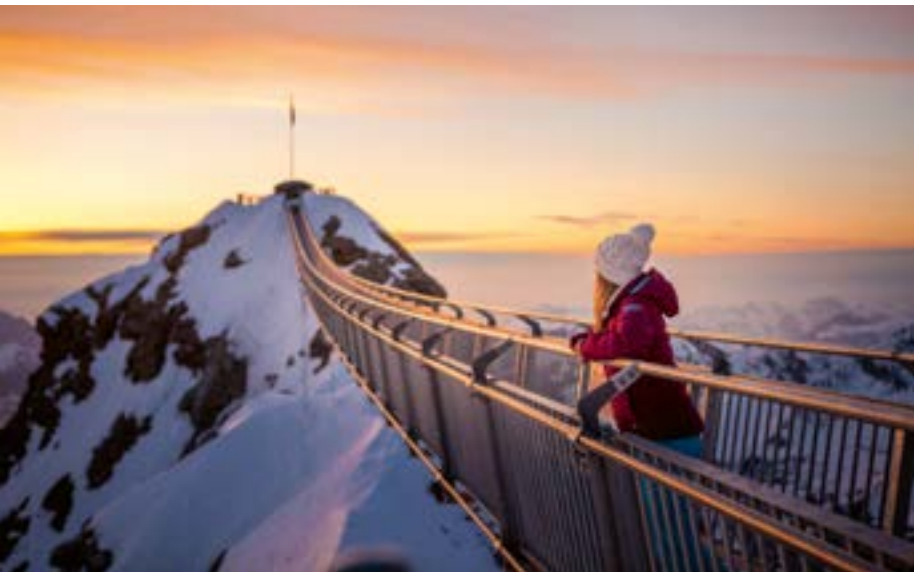

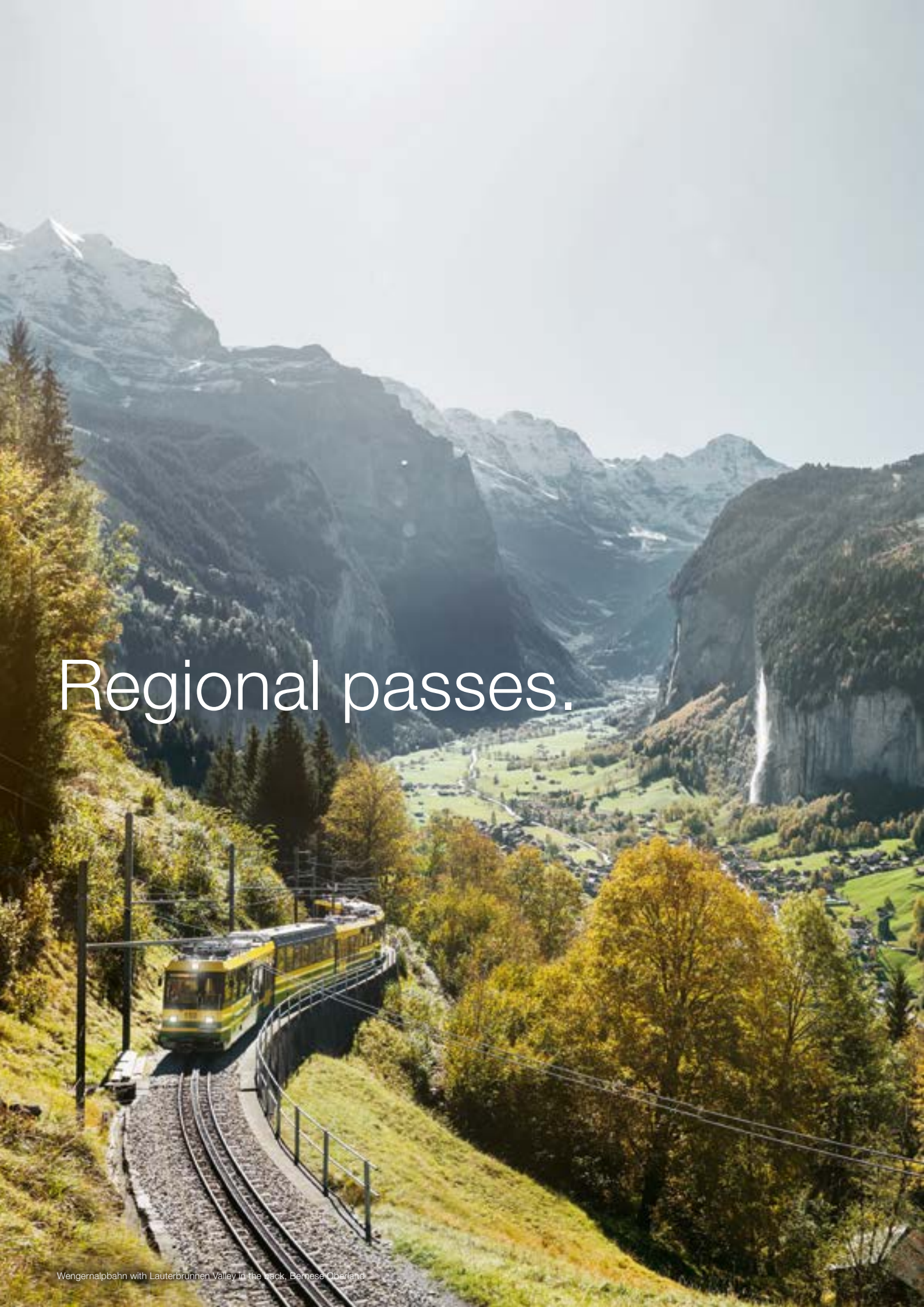

Luggage and flight luggage.

Thanks to the innovative luggage services of Swiss public transport, international guests catch their train shortly after arriving at Zurich Airport. All luggage and flight luggage services come with a handy “door to door” (hotel to hotel) option. Carefree travelling indeed!

Luggage transport to Switzerland

Flight luggage from foreign airport to station (express)

From any airport in the world, luggage can be transported via Zurich Airport to a Swiss destination railway station offering luggage services – no matter which airline. After landing in Switzerland, the passengers’ luggage will be forwarded automatically to the destination railway station. Thus, guests face no loss of time while waiting for their luggage.

Express:

For flights arriving no later than 11.45 h and subject to an express surcharge, the luggage can be available for pick-up at the destination on the same day. This offer is available for the following railway stations: Arosa, Basel SBB, Bern, Brig, Chur, Davos Platz, Engelberg, Grindelwald, Gstaad, Interlaken Ost, Interlaken West, Klosters, Lausanne, Luzern, Mürren, St. Moritz, Wengen, Zermatt, Zürich Main Station.

Standard offer:

Selected railway stations\*:

- Landing before 23.00 h – collection next day from 18.00 h

All other railway stations\*:

- Landing before 23.00 h – collection day after next from 09.00 h

Flight luggage foreign airport to door (hotel)

With this convenient offer, luggage is delivered directly to the guest’s destination hotel on the day following the arrival. For flights arriving no later than 11.45 h and subject to an express surcharge, the luggage can be delivered to the designated hotel on the same day. Express delivery is available for selected tourist destinations.

Luggage door to door (hotel to hotel)

The luggage is picked up at the guest’s address and delivered to the designated address the next day. For deliveries on the same day, an express service option is available (only between selected tourist destinations).

Luggage transport from Switzerland

Flight luggage station to Zurich Airport: all airlines

The luggage is transported from the departure station to Zurich Airport. It must be dropped off at the departure station no later than 19.00 h the day before departure\*. It can be collected from 06.30 h the next morning at the Zurich Airport SBB luggage counter. Guests are then responsible for checking-in their luggage at the check-in counter of their chosen airline. For flights taking off after 16.00 h and only at selected railway stations, the luggage can be dropped off on the morning of the departure day (subject to an express surcharge). Depending on the distance of the railway station from Zurich Airport, drop-off times\* vary. The express service option is available at the following railway stations: Grindelwald, Interlaken Ost, Lauterbrunnen, Mürren, Wengen, Zermatt.

Flight luggage door to Zurich Airport: all airlines

Throughout Switzerland, the luggage is collected at the guest’s hotel on the evening before flight departure and transported to Zurich Airport. It can be collected from 06.30 h the next morning at the Zurich Airport SBB luggage counter. Guests are then responsible for checking-in their luggage at the check-in counter of their chosen airline. For flights taking off after 16.00 h and only at selected Swiss destinations, the luggage can be collected on the morning of the departure day (subject to an express surcharge). The luggage is collected between 06.00 h and 09.00 h.

Flight luggage door to Zurich Airport with check-in: Flights operated by SWISS und Edelweiss Air

Throughout Switzerland, the luggage is collected at the guest’s hotel the evening before flight departure. The service is available for flights leaving from Zurich airport. At luggage collection, guests receive a bag tag and the boarding pass with their flight seat number. Thus, they enjoy more leisure time on departure day without waiting

time at the check-in counter and concerns about luggage. For flights taking off after 16.00 h and only at selected tourist destination, luggage collection service (subject to a surcharge) is also available on the morning of the flight departure. The luggage is collected between 06.00 h and 09.00 h.

Please note:

Customers have to be personally present at luggage collection.

If this is not possible, the service “Flight luggage door to Zurich Airport” (without check-in) has to be used.

Express group luggage door to door (market test)

Express group luggage door to door is available for groups of 10 or more persons (with a maximum of 50 luggage items) travelling in Switzerland by train, bus and boat. The service is available between any two Swiss addresses including Zurich Airport. Luggage collection no later than 09.00 h, delivery the same day before 18.00 h. Booking, transport and payment are handled by SBB.




### Travelling with a dog

Many guests don’t want to leave their four-legged friend behind when travelling by train bus or boat. If dogs are taken along on the passenger coach or on the luggage coach, a half-price 2nd class ticket has to be purchased or the required minimum fare (dog daypass, dog GA) has to be paid. (With a Swiss Travel Pass, a half-price 2nd class ticket has to be purchased as well). Exempt are small dogs up to 30 cm (11.8 in) height at withers in a transport box, cage or some other suitable container. These may be taken along free of charge as hand luggage.

## Information for travellers with reduced mobility.

Whether travelling in a wheelchair or with a visual or a hearing impairment – Swiss public transport offers numerous services facilitating mobility: at the railway station and on the respective means of transport.

### Infrastructure

Barrier-free, independent travel is already possible in numerous means of transport and at many railway stations. Low-floor access, platforms and lifts without steps and the like are just a few of the available installations. This development is actively promoted. If barrier-free travel cannot be fully guaranteed, on-site assistance is provided.



### SBB Call Center Handicap

SBB offers special services for persons with limited mobility and visual impairments. The SBB Call Center Handicap provides information regarding accessibility of stations and trains. It also gives recommendations regarding the choice of a suitable train and offers boarding and disembarking services at larger stations. Requests for boarding or disembarking services should be made no later than one hour prior to travel start. Most express trains offer a wheelchair-accessible compartment.
